Project Overview

- Three-year duration
- Sponsored by the Foundation for California Community Colleges
- Modeled on the American Association of Community Colleges (AACCC) Pathway Project (30 colleges nationwide)
- 20 California Community Colleges selected to participate
- College teams of 5-7 attend six planning institutes over three years
- Annual assessment of KPIs to measure results

- **Institute 1—Leadership for Transformational Change: Implementing Pathways at Scale**
 - Date/Location: September 17-19, 2017 – Costa Mesa
- **Institute 2—Pathway Design I – Mapping Pathways through the Institution**
 - Date/Location: November 30–December 2, 2017 – Fresno / Bakersfield
- **Institute 3—Pathway Design II: Pathways to Transfer and Employment**
 - Date/Location: February 8-10, 2018 – San Diego

- **Institute 4—Redesigning Student Intake and Ongoing Student Support**
 - Date/Location: September 6-8, 2018 – San Francisco
- **Institute 5—Redesigning Basic Skills / Developmental Education as an Onramp to Pathways**
 - Date/Location: January 31 – February 2, 2019 – Riverside
- **Institute 6—Ensuring Students are Learning and Progressing along the Pathway**
 - Date/Location: Sept. 5-7, 2019 – Sacramento

- Why do we need to implement Guided Pathways?



The WHY

- We are failing our students
- Just 42% complete after six years
- We have equity gaps



The WHY

- We are designed for access, but not completion
- We place many barriers to student success
- Our model is based on educating the elite:
 - Students who are well prepared and resourced
- That model does not suit open access students:
 - Unprepared and lacking resources



The Four Pillars

1. Clarify the Path
2. Help Students Get on the Path
3. Help Students Stay on the Path
4. Ensure Students Are Learning
