Cuyamaca College's Meta Major Follow-up Survey Results Spring 2019

Introduction and Method


In Fall 2018, Cuyamaca's Guided Pathways Pillar One Team conducted a major sorting activity with students to create potential meta majors/academic and career clusters. Based on the results of the major sorting activity, the Pillar One Team drafted potential meta majors, which are available in Appendix A.

In January 2019, the Pillar One Team administered an online survey to Cuyamaca faculty members about the potential meta majors that students helped develop. In total, there were 43 responses to this survey. Members from the Guided Pathways Pillar One Team met with members of the Institutional Effectiveness, Success, and Equity office to update the potential meta majors based on faculty feedback, which are available in <u>Appendix B</u>.

To collect student input about the updated meta majors, the Pillar One Team administered a survey via various modalities to obtain feedback from a broad group of online and on-campus students. The survey was administered in person at multiple campus events during Welcome Week in Spring 2019, in person in the Outreach and Counseling office waiting room, and online via GradGuru notifications and Canvas course containers for two weeks in January and February 2019. The Pillar One Team provided all faculty members instructions about administering it to their students. The survey asked respondents to indicate how well the degrees listed in each group fit together; which degree(s), if any, do not belong in each group; and whether they think the group name accurately represents the degrees included in that group. The survey instrument is available in Appendix C. In total, there were 498 valid responses. Student feedback about each meta major is presented on the following pages.


College(s) Attended

Respondents were asked to identify which college(s) they recently attended. Approximately 45% of students recently attended both Cuyamaca and Grossmont, 45% recently attended Cuyamaca only, and 10% recently attended Grossmont only.



Group Naming

Respondents were asked what these groupings of majors/degree programs should be called. The majority of respondents (64%) prefer the term Academic and Career Pathways.

Results for Each Academic and Career Pathway

Overall, the majority of respondents indicated that the degrees listed in each academic and career pathway fit well together, and that the names of each academic and career pathway (e.g., Business, Humanities, STEM) accurately represent the degrees included in those groups.

The Applied Technology academic and career pathway had the <u>lowest</u> percentage of respondents who agreed that the included degrees fit well together (62%).

Respondents who felt that the included degrees did <u>not</u> fit well together were asked which degree(s) did not belong. For the Applied Technology academic and career pathway, respondents noted that Center for Water Studies, Environmental Health and Safety Management, Ornamental Horticulture, and Surveying do not belong in this group. For the Business academic and career pathway, respondents noted that Paralegal Studies did not belong in this group.


The Applied Technology academic and career pathway had the <u>lowest</u> percentage of respondents who agreed that the group name accurately represents the included degrees (79%).

Applied Technology


I think the degrees listed in this group (Applied Technology) fit well together.

Which degree(s) does not belong?



I think the group name (Applied Technology) accurately represents the degrees included in this group.


The majority of respondents (79%) felt that group name accurately represents the included degrees.

The majority of respondents (80%) felt that the degrees listed in this group fit well together.










More than 10% of respondents indicated that Paralegal Studies (11%) does not belong in this group.


The majority of respondents (96%) felt that group name accurately represents the included degrees.






Humanities


Which degree(s) does not belong?








STEM






Visual and Performing Arts

The majority of respondents (93%) felt that the degrees listed in this group fit well together.








Visual and Performing Arts


