

# COLLEGE AND CAREER ACCESS PATHWAYS PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GROSSMONT-CUYAMACA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND GROSSMONT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT January 2022 – July 2023

- Whereas Grossmont Union High School District (GUHSD) is a high school district, operating within Eastern San Diego County, with its District Office located at 1100 Murray Drive, El Cajon, CA 92020, herein referred to as "GUHSD;" and
- Whereas this effort is intended to support the 21<sup>st</sup> century idea that college readiness, as well as career and workforce readiness are beneficial and necessary to help young people compete in this new economy, realize their full potential, increase high school graduation rates, and increase college attendance rates and college completion rates, while helping families in our region to prosper through higher education; and
- Whereas pursuant to California Education Code section 76004(a), the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District (GCCCD) and Grossmont Union High School District (GUHSD) (including the high schools in the District's jurisdiction) may enter into a partnership that is governed by College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership Agreement (AGREEMENT) approved by the governing boards of GCCCD and GUHSD in accordance with California Education Code section 76004 and Title 5 sections 55300 et seq., respectively; and
- Whereas GCCCD and GUHSD desire to continue the collaborative effort of their CCAP program within the guidelines of an AGREEMENT for the purpose of expanding CCAP course opportunities for all students, particularly those who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education, with the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education and preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, and helping high school students achieve college and career readiness; and
- Whereas the operational aspects of the CCAP partnership are incorporated into this AGREEMENT, the provisions of which establish adherence to various education code requirements pertaining to, among other things, allowances, apportionments, and enrollment; now, therefore, be it
- Resolved, that this AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of the date written below by and between the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District and the Grossmont Union High School District.

#### **TERMS OF AGREEMENT**

## 1. TERM OF AGREEMENT

1.1. The term of this AGREEMENT shall be January 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

#### 2. ADMISSIONS AND REGISTRATION

- 2.1. Admissions and registration shall be coordinated by the AGREEMENT conditions for enrollment and all other applicable policies and procedures established by GCCCD.
- 2.2. Prior to registering for a CCAP course, students shall complete and submit CCAP permission forms and all appropriate college matriculation paperwork, including a parental consent to be enrolled in community college courses.
- 2.3. GUHSD shall pay the total cost of books and materials for GUHSD students who enroll in a CCAP. Instructors will be encouraged to use open educational resources. Selected books and materials shall be used for at least five (5) years before they are replaced. Additionally, GUHSD and GCCCD agree to actively pursue funds and resources to help fund student books and materials.
- 2.4. Registration and access to all CCAP courses under this AGREEMENT shall not be open to the general public, in accordance with California Education Code section 76004.
- 2.5. All CCAP courses shall meet the enrollment requirements as set forth by GCCCD or as mutually agreed upon by GUHSD and GCCCD.

## 3. COURSES

- 3.1. Courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be initiated by GUHSD and go through the approval process at GCCCD. No CCAP course will be offered on a high school campus without approval by GUHSD.
- 3.2. Courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be of the same quality and rigor as those offered on a GCCCD campus.
- 3.3. Courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be GCCCD-catalogued courses with GCCCD department designations, course descriptions, numbers, titles, and credits.
- 3.4. Courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall adhere to the official GCCCD course outlines of record and the student learning outcomes established by the associated academic departments within GCCCD.

- 3.5. Site visits by one or more representatives of the COLLEGE shall be permitted by GUHSD to ensure that courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT at GUHSD's location have the same quality and rigor as the courses offered on a GCCCD campus.
- 3.6. CCAP courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall support the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or helping high school students achieve college and career readiness.
- 3.7. Courses offered through this AGREEMENT are selected through mutual agreement by the high school Principals at GUHSD and college Presidents at GCCCD consistent with the core mission of the community colleges pursuant to California Education Code section 66010.4, and in assurance that students participating in a CCAP partnership will not lead to enrollment displacement of otherwise eligible adults in the community college.
- 3.8. A student may receive both college credit and high school credit for GCCCD courses that he/she/they complete, as determined to be appropriate by the governing boards of GUHSD and GCCCD, and in accordance with California Education Code sections 48802 and 76001(c) and other state and federal laws.
- 3.9. GCCCD shall not provide physical education course opportunities or any other course opportunities that do not assist in the attainment of the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or helping high school students achieve college and career readiness.

# 4. CCAP COURSE INSTRUCTORS

- 4.1. Instructors teaching a course pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be GCCCD-approved teachers who meet the California Community College Chancellor's Office minimum qualifications for faculty in the community colleges for the discipline they are assigned to teach.
- 4.2. GUHSD instructors who meet the California Community College Chancellor's Office minimum qualifications to teach a college course will have priority teaching a CCAP course on a GUHSD high school campus. If there are no qualified GUHSD instructors available to teach an agreed upon course, then GCCCD will provide the faculty member to teach the course.
  - CCAP faculty who are employees of GUHSD shall be paid all salaries, wages and benefits by GUHSD.

- GCCCD faculty teaching CCAP courses shall be paid all salaries, wages, and benefits by GCCCD.
- 4.3. This AGREEMENT certifies that a community college instructor teaching a course at the GUHSD campus has not displaced or resulted in the termination of an existing high school teacher teaching the same course on that high school campus.
- 4.4. This AGREEMENT certifies that a qualified high school teacher teaching a course offered for college credit at a GUHSD campus has not displaced or resulted in the termination of an existing GCCCD faculty member teaching the same course at the partnering community college campus.
- 4.5. GUHSD shall be solely responsible for all salaries, wages, and benefits due to GUHSD instructors approved to teach a course pursuant to this AGREEMENT. GCCCD shall reimburse GUHSD the cost of the salary and mandated benefits for the course up to the average amount a GCCCD instructor would be paid for the same course (Class III Step 7 of the classroom adjunct/overload salary schedule).
- 4.6. An instructor provided by GUHSD will be expected to participate in all professional development activities required by GCCCD and shall be encouraged to participate in ongoing collegial interaction to address course content, course delivery, assessment, evaluation, and/or research and development in the field. The COLLEGE shall submit a list of required activities to GUHSD before the semester begins. The total number of hours required shall not exceed one week of scheduled class hours.
- 4.7. All instructors who teach CCAP courses will be under the supervision and control of the COLLEGE deans who have oversight for the corresponding disciplines while teaching the course and performing any course related work or activities.
- 4.8. Instructors who teach CCAP courses must provide the supervision and control reasonably necessary for the protection of the health and safety of students and may not have any other assigned duties during the instructional activity. The instructor must be physically present in the classroom or laboratory or within line-of-sight of the students at all scheduled instructional times.
- 4.9. Instructor performance shall be evaluated by GCCCD using the adopted evaluation process and standards for faculty of GCCCD, subject to the approval of GCCCD.
- 4.10. GCCCD and GUHSD through mutual agreement shall determine the number of instructors, the ratio of instructors to students, and the subject areas of instruction for courses offered under this AGREEMENT. The

- instructor-to-student ratio will not exceed the collective bargaining agreement with GEA.
- 4.11. As with any GCCCD course, instructors teaching under this AGREEMENT must teach according to official GCCCD course outlines of record, including coverage of content and limits on instructional hours.
- 4.12. Instructors teaching under this AGREEMENT must submit final grades by both GUHSD and GCCCD final grade deadlines each semester.

#### 5. LIAISON

- 5.1. GCCCD shall appoint an educational administrator who will serve as liaison and who will approve all CCAP instructors in consultation with the academic departments of GCCCD.
- 5.2. The GCCCD liaison shall coordinate initial and ongoing training for instructors teaching a course pursuant to this AGREEMENT, site visits, and GCCCD performance evaluations for instructors teaching courses pursuant to this AGREEMENT, and strengthen communication between essential elements of GUHSD, GCCCD, academic departments, and student affairs.
- 5.3. The GCCCD liaison will ensure that instructors teaching a course pursuant to this AGREEMENT are informed of new curriculum developments, pedagogic innovations, textbook adoptions, educational outcomes, assessment of learning, grading standards, proficiency expectations and syllabus components.
- 5.4. GUHSD shall appoint an educational program coordinator who will serve as a liaison between GUHSD and GCCCD to facilitate coordination and cooperation between GUHSD and the COLLEGE in conformity with GUHSD policies and standards.

#### 6. ON-SITE SUPERVISION

6.1. Courses offered pursuant to this AGREEMENT and students in those courses shall be under the supervision of the administrator designated by GCCCD as the liaison as provided in Section 5.1.

#### 7. STUDENTS

7.1. Students must meet all GCCCD prerequisite requirements as established by GCCCD and stated in the GCCCD catalog before enrolling in a CCAP course pursuant to this AGREEMENT, may include, but not limited to, obtaining a satisfactory score on any required placement test or filing a GCCCD prerequisite/corequisite enrollment limitation challenge and providing documentation evidencing knowledge or ability to succeed in the course or program despite not meeting the prerequisite or corequisite.

- 7.2. Grades earned by students enrolled in courses pursuant to this CCAP AGREEMENT will be posted on official GCCCD transcripts. Students are eligible to request Pass/No Pass or Credit/No Credit if the course is eligible for this option as noted in the GCCCD catalog, except in cases where the course is satisfying a GUHSD graduation requirement. In such cases, GUHSD must inform GCCCD in writing and before the census date of which students are not eligible for Pass/No Pass or Credit/No Credit grading for each section. Students may audit a GCCCD course if space is available and the course permits this option as noted in the GCCCD catalog.
- 7.3. Students enrolled in courses pursuant to this AGREEMENT will be directed to the official catalog of the GCCCD.
- 7.4. Students enrolled in courses pursuant to this AGREEMENT will be eligible for student support services, which shall be available to them at GCCCD and GUHSD.
- 7.5. Students who withdraw from a course pursuant to this AGREEMENT will not receive any GCCCD credit for work completed and must submit appropriate information/paperwork by all published deadlines.
- 7.6. A dropped class within the GCCCD drop date will not appear on the college or high school transcript as a GCCCD course. A student must complete the course to receive high school credit. The withdrawal (W) deadline for a course will be established to align with the high school drop date. Students who withdraw will receive a W on their college transcript.
- 7.7. Students enrolled in CCAP courses pursuant to this AGREEMENT are exempt from payment of GCCCD enrollment fees pursuant to California Education Code sections 49011 and 76004(f).

## 8. ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING AND CONDUCT

- 8.1. Students enrolled in CCAP courses shall be held to the same standards of achievement as students in sections located on a GCCCD campus.
- 8.2. Students enrolled in CCAP courses shall be held to the same grading standards as those expected of students in sections located on a GCCCD campus.
- 8.3. Students enrolled in CCAP courses shall be assessed using the same methods (e.g., papers, portfolios, quizzes, labs, exams, projects, and presentations) as students in sections located on a GCCCD campus.
- 8.4. Students enrolled in CCAP courses shall be held to the same behavioral standards as those expected of students in sections located on the GCCCD campus and on the high school campus.

# 9. EVALUATION

- 9.1. GCCCD and GUHSD may request that students evaluate each CCAP course offered at GUHSD in accordance with established guidelines approved by the GCCCD conforming with its faculty union collective bargaining agreement.
- 9.2. GCCCD and GUHSD may survey and collect data on students and alumni of CCAP courses after they graduate from GUHSD.
- 9.3. GCCCD and GUHSD may annually conduct surveys of participating instructors, principals, and guidance counselors.
- GCCCD and GUHSD shall share survey data for the purpose of informing practice, making adjustments, and improving the quality of CCAP course delivery.

## 10. STUDENT RECORDS AND PRIVACY

- 10.1. Records of student attendance and achievement for all GUHSD students who enroll in a CCAP course shall be maintained by GUHSD and by the GCCCD electronic records system or other equivalent and mutually agreed upon systems through the course instructor.
- 10.2. In order to obtain necessary historical performance data on students exiting from GUHSD and subsequently enrolling at GCCCD, it is necessary for the parties to share student data on an ongoing basis at times and in forms agreed to by the parties. GCCCD will subsequently provide, at times and in forms agreed upon by the parties, data back to GUHSD concerning the performance of the former GUHSD students who subsequently enrolled at GCCCD.
- 10.3. GCCCD and GUHSD understand and agree that education records of students enrolled in the CCAP course and personally identifiable information contained in those educational records are subject to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) 20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 C.F.R. Part 99, including the disclosure provisions of § 99.30 and state law as set forth in California Education Code sections 49064 and 49076. GCCCD and GUHSD agree to hold all student education records generated pursuant to this AGREEMENT in strict confidence, and further agree not to re-disclose such records except as authorized by applicable law or regulation or by the parent or guardian's prior written consent. (34 C.F.R. § 99.33 (a), (b); 34 C.F.R. § 99.34(b) and California Education Code sections 49064 and 49076.)
- 10.4. Limitation on Use. GCCCD and GUHSD shall use each student education record that is received pursuant to this AGREEMENT solely for purposes consistent with the authority to access that information pursuant

- to federal and state law, as applicable. (34 C.F.R. § 99.31, 34 C.F.R. § 99.34, and California Education Code section 49076.)
- 10.5. Recordkeeping Requirements. GCCCD and GUHSD shall comply with the requirements governing maintenance of records and of each request for access to and each disclosure of student education records set forth under Title 34, Code of Federal Regulations section 99.32 and under California Education Code section 49064, as applicable.
- 10.6. Acknowledgement of Receipt of Notice of FERPA Regulations. By signature of its authorized representative or agent on this AGREEMENT, GCCCD and GUHSD hereby acknowledge that they have been provided with the notice required under 34 C.F.R.§ 99.33(d) that they are strictly prohibited from disclosing student education records to any other person or entity except as authorized by applicable law or regulation or by the parent or guardian's prior written consent.

#### 11. REIMBURSEMENT

11.1 If the course instructor is an employee of GUHSD, then GCCCD shall reimburse GUHSD at an amount to be agreed upon in writing by GCCCD and GUHSD (see section 4.5 above).

## 12. FACILITIES USE

- 12.1. GUHSD will provide adequate classroom space at its facilities, or other mutually agreed upon location, to conduct the instruction and do so without charge to GCCCD or to students. GUHSD agrees to clean, maintain, and safeguard GUHSD's premises. GUHSD warrants that its facilities are safe and compliant with all applicable building, fire, and safety codes.
- 12.2. Pursuant to this agreement GUHSD will furnish, at its own expense, all course materials, specialized equipment, books, and other necessary equipment for all GUHSD students. The parties understand that such equipment and materials are the sole property of GUHSD. GCCCD shall determine the type, make, and model of all equipment, books, and materials to be used during each course offered as part of this AGREEMENT pursuant to section 2.3 above. GUHSD understands that students shall not be required to pay for equipment or material fees pursuant to California Education Code section 49011.
- 12.3. GCCCD facilities may be used for events or instruction subject to mutual agreement by the parties.

#### 13. INDEMNIFICATION

- 13.1. GCCCD agrees to and shall indemnify, save, and hold harmless GUHSD and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs, expenses, damages, causes of action, losses, and judgments, arising out of GCCCD's performance of or in connection with this AGREEMENT. The obligation to indemnify shall extend to all claims and losses that arise from the negligence of GCCCD, its officers, and its employees.
- 13.2. GUHSD agrees to and shall indemnify, save, and hold harmless GCCCD, its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs, expenses, damages, causes of action, losses, and judgments, arising out of GUHSD's performance of or in connection with this AGREEMENT. The obligation to indemnify shall extend to all claims and losses that arise from the negligence of GUHSD, its officers, and its employees.

## 14. INSURANCE

- 14.1. GUHSD, in order to protect GCCCD, its agents, employees, and officers against claims and liability for death, injury, loss, and damage, shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure, and maintain, for the duration of this AGREEMENT, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by GUHSD, GUHSD agents, representatives, officers, employees, or students. GUHSD shall maintain the following insurance coverages.
  - 1. Commercial general liability insurance coverage in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate.
  - 2. Commercial automobile liability insurance coverage only if GUHSD is providing services that require GUHSD to transport GCCCD personnel, students, or property in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit.
  - 3. Workers' compensation insurance as required by the California Labor Code and employer's liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 per accident or occupational illness.
  - 4. Professional Liability/Errors & Omissions (E&O) liability insurance coverage of at least \$1,000,000 for each claim, incident, or occurrence, and at least \$2,000,000 annual aggregate coverage. This policy shall provide extended reporting period coverage for claims made within three years after this AGREEMENT is completed or otherwise terminated according to its terms.
  - 5. Sexual abuse or molestation insurance coverage. This policy shall provide extended reporting period coverage for claims made within

three years after this AGREEMENT is completed or otherwise terminated according to its terms.

GUHSD will provide the following endorsements for all lines of insurance coverage.

- a) ADDITIONAL INSURED endorsement equivalent naming GCCCD, its Board of Trustees, and their officials, employees, and agents as additional insured.
- b) CANCELLATION endorsement which provides that the GCCCD is entitled to 30 days prior written notice of cancellation or nonrenewal of the policy, or reduction in coverage, by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- c) CONTRIBUTION NOT REQUIRED endorsement which provides that the insurance afforded is primary to any insurance or self-insurance of GCCCD, its Board of Trustees, or their officials, employees, or agents as respects operations of the Named Insured. Any insurance maintained by GCCCD, its Board of Trustees, or their officials, employees, or agents shall be in excess of GUHSD's insurance and shall not contribute to it.
- d) SEVERABILITY OF INTEREST endorsement which provides that GCCCD's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom a claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- e) ADDITIONAL INSURED COVERAGE NOT AFFECTED BY INSURED'S DUTIES AFTER ACCIDENT OR LOSS endorsement. The policy must be endorsed to provide that any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policy shall not affect coverage to GCCCD, its Board of Trustees, or their officials, employees, or agents.
- f) WAIVER OF SUBROGATION endorsement which provides that the insurer will waive its right of subrogation against GCCCD, its Boards and Commissions, and their officials, employees and agents with respect to any losses paid under the terms of the workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance policy which arise from work performed by the Named Insured for GCCCD.
- 14.2. GCCCD, in order to protect GUHSD, its agents, employees, and officers against claims and liability for death, injury, loss, and damage, shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure, and maintain, for the duration of this AGREEMENT, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by GCCCD, GCCCD agents, representatives, officers, employees, or students. GCCCD shall maintain the following insurance coverages.

- 1. Commercial general liability insurance coverage in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate.
- 2. Commercial automobile liability insurance coverage only if GCCCD is providing services that require GCCCD to transport GUHSD personnel, students, or property in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit.
- 3. Workers' compensation insurance as required by the California Labor Code and employer's liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 per accident or occupational illness.
- 4. Professional Liability/Errors & Omissions (E&O) liability insurance coverage of at least \$1,000,000 for each claim, incident, or occurrence, and at least \$2,000,000 annual aggregate coverage. This policy shall provide extended reporting period coverage for claims made within three years after this AGREEMENT is completed or otherwise terminated according to its terms.
- 5. Sexual abuse or molestation insurance coverage. This policy shall provide extended reporting period coverage for claims made within three years after this AGREEMENT is completed or otherwise terminated according to its terms.

GCCCD will provide the following endorsements for all lines of insurance coverage.

- a) ADDITIONAL INSURED endorsement equivalent naming GUHSD, its Board of Trustees, and their officials, employees, and agents as additional insured.
- b) CANCELLATION endorsement which provides that GUHSD is entitled to 30 days prior written notice of cancellation or nonrenewal of the policy, or reduction in coverage, by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- c) CONTRIBUTION NOT REQUIRED endorsement which provides that the insurance afforded is primary to any insurance or self-insurance of GUHSD, its Board of Trustees, or their officials, employees, or agents as respects operations of the Named Insured. Any insurance maintained by GUHSD, its Board of Trustees, or their officials, employees, or agents shall be in excess of GCCCD's insurance and shall not contribute to it.
- d) SEVERABILITY OF INTEREST endorsement which provides that GUHSD's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom a claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- e) ADDITIONAL INSURED COVERAGE NOT AFFECTED BY INSURED'S DUTIES AFTER ACCIDENT OR LOSS endorsement. The policy must be endorsed to provide that any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policy shall not affect coverage to GUHSD, its Board of Trustees, or their officials, employees, or agents.

f) WAIVER OF SUBROGATION endorsement which provides that the insurer will waive its right of subrogation against GUHSD, its Boards and Commissions, and their officials, employees and agents with respect to any losses paid under the terms of the workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance policy which arise from work performed by the Named Insured for GUHSD.

## 15. APPORTIONMENT/AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE

- 15.1. GCCCD will include the students enrolled in the CCAP courses in its report of FTES for purposes of receiving state apportionments, so long as the CCAP courses comply with current requirements for CCAP courses under applicable California law.
- 15.2. The parties agree, and GUHSD will ensure, that all students participating in the CCAP program are enrolled in no less than the number of instructional minutes required to complete a minimum school day (240 minutes), pursuant to Education Code Section 46141 and 46142, exclusive of any CCAP classes.
- 15.3. GUHSD may not report and receive payment for all average daily attendance (ADA) unless GCCCD agrees not to claim FTES for the same course.

#### 16. CERTIFICATIONS

- 16.1. The parties certify that both GUHSD and GCCCD will comply with local collective bargaining agreements and all state and federal reporting requirements regarding the qualifications of the GUHSD teacher or community college faculty member teaching a CCAP course offered for high school credit.
- 16.2. GCCCD certifies that it does not receive full compensation for the direct education costs of the CCAP courses from any public or private agency, individual, or group.
- 16.3. GUHSD certifies that the instructional activity to be conducted pursuant to this AGREEMENT will not be fully funded by other sources.
- 16.4. GCCCD certifies that any GCCCD instructor teaching a course on a GUHSD campus has not been convicted of any sex offense as defined in California Education Code section 87010 or as amended, or any controlled substance offense as defined in California Education Code section 87011 or as amended.
- 16.5. GCCCD and GUHSD agree that as a condition of adopting this AGREEMENT, GCCCD governing board and the GUHSD governing board at an open public meeting of each respective board shall present

the AGREEMENT, take testimony from the public, and shall approve or disapprove the AGREEMENT.

#### 17. NON-DISCRIMINATION

17.1. Neither GCCCD nor GUHSD shall discriminate on the basis of race or ethnicity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, religion, or any other characteristic that is contained in the definition of hate crimes set forth in the California Penal Code.

# 18. TERMINATION OR CHANGES

- 18.1. Either party may terminate this AGREEMENT at any time by providing 30 days' written notice to the other party. Written notice of termination or changes to this AGREEMENT shall be addressed to the responsible person listed below. The parties will endeavor to avoid cancelling the agreement during the semester to avoid negatively impacting students.
- 18.2. If this AGREEMENT is to be terminated while any courses are still in progress, GUHSD and GCCCD shall develop a mutually agreed upon teach-out plan that will enable the enrolled students to complete the CCAP Partnership course(s) they are enrolled in as of the date of termination of this AGREEMENT.
